The following document is the working document for review of Statutes, Bye-laws and Regulations for ARF.

The final proposals of the WG (based on majority voting) were submitted to the ARF Executive Committee and then to the ARF Congress in Palembang, INA, for approval in August 2018.

ASIAN ROWING FEDERATION - REGULATIONS FOR ARF REGATTAS		
Regulation 1. – Application		
These Regulations shall apply to ARF Regattas.		
The FISA Rules of Racing shall apply to all such regattas		
unless:		
1) Otherwise stated in these Regulations, or		
2) Deviation from the FISA Rules of Racing is		
specifically permitted by the Executive Committee		
for a particular regatta.		
Regulation 2. – Allotting of ARF Regattas		
The Congress shall in principle allot the organization of		
ARF Regattas a minimum of two years in advance.		
However, it may allot the organization of Asian Rowing		
Cup regattas at least one year in advance.		
Regulation 3 – Appointment of Technical Delegates		
The Executive Committee may appoint a Technical		
Delegate for any ARF Regatta where a Technical Delegate		
has not been appointed by FISA. Such an appointment by		
ARF may be made in consultation with FISA in accordance		
with the FISA Rules of Racing. The duties of the Technical
